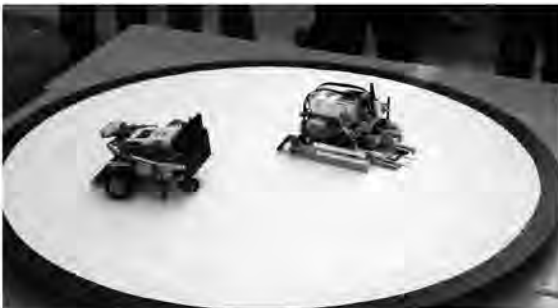
When: Wednesday June 12, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.- 9?

PREMIUM - \$500.00

1. Exhibits are open to 4-H members in Calloway County only.
2. Clover bud exhibits should be like the regular 4-H exhibits. Mini exhibits
3. All exhibits must be finished and have been completed during the current project year (since the last county fair).
4. 4-H'ers may enter only one exhibit per class unless otherwise noted.
5. Exhibits entered in the wrong class will not be eligible for class champion.
6. All exhibits must be entered from 2:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. on **Saturday June 8**.
7. Entries must be removed between 11:00 a.m. to 1 p.m. on **Monday June 17**. Any exhibit removed before 11:00 a.m. on June 17 will not be eligible for premium money. Premiums will be forfeited if entries are not picked up at designated time. Entries not picked up at the designated time will be left in the building at the owner's risk.
8. The decisions of the judges will be final.
9. Premium money of \$500.00 will be awarded on the following basis. Each entry will be classified blue, red or white. In all lots, each entry classified white will receive 1x money; red, 2x money; and blue, 3x money.
10. Care will be taken to guard and protect exhibits, but 4-H and the Fair Board will not be liable.
11. The Fair Board and 4-H will not be responsible for items not picked up by **1:00** p.m. on Monday June 17.
12. Social security numbers and birthdays will be required for champions sending exhibits to the State Fair.
13. Every effort has been made to update our County Fair 4-H catalog to be in line with the State Fair 4-H Catalog. However, if there is a mistake, we will work with the category champion to be in line with the state fair before state fair entries are made.
