6. Judging will be done based on quality, and the decision of the judges will be final.
7. No more than 2 entries may be made in the same class, by the same exhibitor.

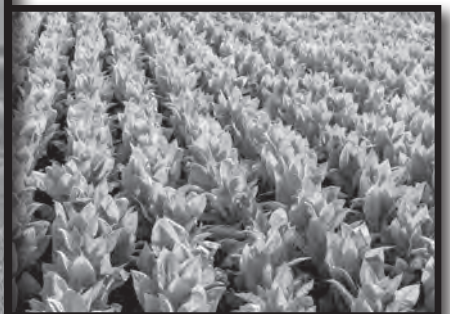

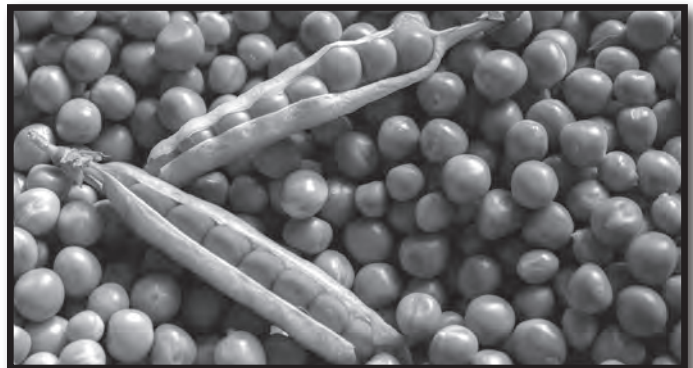
